Washington State University Vancouver University Publications 1990-present

Washington State University Vancouver Publications (WSUV.Pubs) have been acquired from a variety of sources through the years. Some of the items have been transferred from the Library's serials and technical services. Other items come directly from university departments or are donated by individuals. In 2016 the Archives and Special Collections began arranging and describing these published materials as archival and created this finding aid.

Collection History

WSUV.Pubs was created in 2016 as an effort to preserve significant publications produced by WSU Vancouver. The collection includes publications that are no longer active in the Library's collections, publications that are ephemeral in nature or publications that have been donated as archival materials by departments on campus. Some of the publications in this collection had been accumulated by the Library since the beginning of its operations in the early 1990s.

Description

WSUV.Pubs includes materials ranging from student handbooks, campus maps, pamphlets and college catalogs as well as notable past and present publications like the VanCougar student newspaper and the Northwest Crimson & Gray magazine.

Arrangement

The publications in this collection are arranged by department of origin, which is assigned a number based on order of entry into the archives. A subsequent number is given for each publication title given within the department. For example, WSUV.Pubs 3 designates the Office of Marketing and Communications as a department of origin followed by WSUV.Pubs 3-1 as the number given to the department's publication, Northwest Crimson & Gray magazine. This number serves as both the location number and call number for the publication.

Access

Items are identified by a "WSUV Pubs" number, which serves as a location number and a call number. This number should be used to request items through the Archives and Special Collections. Access to the publications are for library use only. Check the Archives and Special Collections use policy as well as digital collections for possible online access to publications.

The VanCougar began as a newsletter published by the Associated Students of Washington State University Vancouver (ASWSUV) in 1990 before evolving into a full-fledged campus newspaper. (Note that VanCougar staff inaccurately accessioned its volumes from 2009-2013. This was corrected by VanCougar staff by the end of the Spring term in 2013, resuming the correct accessioning with vol.23. An asterisk (*) is used to distinguish the volumes that are mislabeled from those with original volume numbers. The publication features works from students, faculty and staff. 1997 marks the first year of publication for the journal, which was initially called Salmon Creek. (Note that no volume was published in 1998. Missing years: 2003).</p>

WSUV.Pubs 4-1		<p>WSU Vancouver Student Handbook, 1993-2004. An annual handbook with rules and guidelines for students to follow during their enrollment at WSU Vancouver. The handbooks are a publication of Student Services. (Missing years: 1996-1997)</p>

WSUV.Pubs 5 WSU Vancouver Information Technology (formerly *Vancouver Information Services (VIS)*)

WSUV.Pubs 5-1

Vis a Vis, 1997-1996, 2002. A newsletter published by Vancouver Information Services (VIS), the integration of departments in the 1990s and 2000s that included the library, the computer labs, computer technical support and Washington Higher Education Telecommunications System (WHETS) in Vancouver. The newsletter existed as a medium to update students, faculty, staff and general patrons of the services provided by VIS. The publication includes highlights of electronic resources, software, changes in the availability of campus technology and general library services. The newsletter disbanded in the early 2000s. VIS dissolved in the late 2000s reverted to separate departments.

WSUV.Pubs 5-2

Annual Report, 2016-2017. The WSU Vancouver Information Technology Annual Report highlights resources and services provided on the WSU Vancouver campus by IT. The report focuses on improvements, upgrades as well as IT accomplishments. Includes features of IT staff and technology by the numbers.

Research Showcase Abstracts, 2016 - Present. The Research Showcase is an annual event that highlights exceptional undergraduate and graduate research at WSU Vancouver. Earlier inceptions of the Research Showcase included faculty research. In 2008, the format of the event changed to focus exclusively on student research achievements.
